## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

### Investment Objective and Strategies

The NBI Canadian Equity Fund's investment objective is to achieve long-term capital growth. The Fund invests directly or indirectly in a portfolio comprised mainly of equity securities of large-capitalization Canadian issuers.

The portfolio manager analyzes stocks through a valuation approach of "growth at a reasonable price" with a long-term investment horizon. Based on fundamental analysis, the portfolio manager identifies companies with above average growth prospects and below average risk. Securities held in the portfolio are common and/or preferred shares of large-capitalization companies that are industry leaders, have strong management, a good earnings track record and reasonable financial leverage. The fund may invest up to 49% of its assets in securities of foreign issuers.

### Risks

The Fund's risk level was modified from "low to medium" to "medium" during the year. This change aims to more accurately reflect the Fund's actual risk level.

### Results of Operations

For the twelve-month period ended December 31, 2023, the NBI Canadian Equity Fund's Investor Series units returned 17.89% compared to 11.75% for the Fund's benchmark, the S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index (CAD). Unlike the benchmark, the Fund's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please see the *Past Performance* section for the returns of all of the Fund's series, which may vary mainly because of fees and expenses.

Certain series of the Fund, as applicable, may make distributions at a rate determined by the manager. This rate may change from time to time. If the aggregate amount of distributions in such series exceeds the portion of net income and net realized capital gains allocated to such series, the excess will constitute a return of capital. The manager does not believe that the return of capital distributions made by such series of the Fund have a meaningful impact on the Fund's ability to implement its investment strategy or to fulfill its investment objective.

The Fund's net asset value rose by 17.80% over the period, from \$780.19 million as at December 31, 2022 to \$919.05 million as at December 31, 2023.

The increase stemmed mainly from investments in the Fund by other NBI Funds and market fluctuations.

Financial markets more than reversed their third quarter declines to close the year with strong year-over-year gains. In the quarter, yields on short-term bonds declined at a faster pace than those on long-term bonds as bond investors priced in greater expectations of central bank reductions in their overnight policy rates. Global equity markets rose in the final quarter of the year, supported by the Fed's more accommodative monetary stance in light of moderating inflationary pressures.

In this context, the Fund outperformed its benchmark.

- The main contributors to performance were the overweight position in Industrials and Information Technology, and underweight in Communication Services, which was partly offset by lower portfolio returns in Consumer Staples.
- The main detractor to performance was our stock selection in the less commodity sensitive securities and underweight position in the Energy sector, as well as our Stock Selection and overweight position in the Health Care sector.
- The top individual contributors to performance in the portfolio were AtkinsRéalis and Shopify.
- The top individual detractors to performance in the portfolio were Altus Group, Franco Nevada, and AIA Group.

### Recent Developments

In the past year, we exited our positions in Brookfield Asset Management (following a corporate action) and Transcontinental Inc.

We initiated a new position in Tourmaline Oil Corporation.

- Compared to the index, the Fund is most overweight in Information Technology and Industrials.
- The Fund is most underweight in Financials and Materials.

The fact that inflation normalized without the need for a recession suggests that policy can also normalize toward lower interest rates and tighter fiscal policy. With markets beginning the 2024 year at elevated levels, anything other than a soft landing, such as a recession or strong growth, may lead to scenarios with more risk and volatility. We view our quality approach as well suited for this type of environment and continue to favour conservatively managed businesses that fit our investment criteria.

On May 1, 2023, the Fund's independent review committee (the "IRC") was increased to four members when Stéphanie Raymond-Bougie was appointed as IRC member.

On or around November 15, 2023, National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT") replaced Jarislowsky, Fraser Limited ("Jarislowsky, Fraser") as portfolio manager of the Fund. Effective on the same date, NBT retained Jarislowsky, Fraser as portfolio sub-advisor for the Fund.

### Related Party Transactions

National Bank of Canada ("the Bank") and its affiliated companies' roles and responsibilities related to the Fund are as follows:

#### Fund Manager

The Fund is managed by National Bank Investments Inc. ("NBII"), which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank. Therefore, NBII provides or ensures the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund's current operations, including investment consulting, the arrangement of brokerage contracts for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, bookkeeping and other administrative services required by the Fund.

The Manager pays the operating expenses of the Fund other than its "Fund costs" (defined below) (the "variable operating expenses"), in exchange for the Fund's payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Fund.

The administration fees are equal to a specified percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Fund, calculated and paid in the same manner as the Fund's management fees. The variable operating expenses payable by the Manager include, but are not limited to: transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; custodial costs; accounting and valuation fees; audit fees and legal fees; costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, simplified prospectuses, annual information forms, Fund Facts, continuous disclosure material and other securityholder communications; and costs of trustee services relating to registered tax plans, as applicable.

In addition to administration fees, the Fund shall also pay certain Fund costs, namely: taxes (including, but not limited to, GST/HST and income taxes); costs of compliance with any changes to existing governmental or regulatory requirements introduced after August 1, 2013; costs of compliance with any new governmental or regulatory requirements, including any new fees introduced after August 1, 2013; interest and borrowing costs; costs related to external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as at August 1, 2013; Independent Review Committee costs, including compensation paid to IRC members, travel expenses, insurance premiums and costs associated with their continuing education; and variable operating expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Fund.

The Manager may, from time to time and at its sole discretion, decide to absorb a portion of a series' management fees, administration fees or Fund costs.

As described under the heading *Management Fees*, the Fund pays annual management fees to NBII as consideration for its services.

### Portfolio Manager

The Manager has appointed National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of the Bank, as the portfolio manager for the Fund. A flat fee is payable annually to NBT for its management services.

### Distribution and Dealer Compensation

NBII acts as principal distributor for the Fund. In this capacity, NBII buys, sells and swaps securities through Bank branches and the National Bank Investments Advisory Service in Canadian provinces and territories, and through external registered representatives. Fund securities are also offered by National Bank Financial Inc. (including its division National Bank Direct Brokerage), CABN Investments (a division of NBII) and other affiliated entities. Brokers may receive, depending on the distributed series, a monthly commission representing a percentage of the average daily value of the securities held by their clients.

### Independent Review Committee Approvals and Recommendations

The Fund followed the standing instructions of its Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

- Purchasing or holding the securities of a related issuer, in particular, those of National Bank of Canada;
- Investing in the securities of an issuer when an entity related to the manager acts as an underwriter for the placement or at any time during the 60-day period after the end of the placement;
- Purchasing or selling securities to another investment fund managed by the manager or a company in the same group;
- Purchasing or selling debt securities on the secondary market, through related brokers that are main brokers in the Canadian debt securities market (in accordance with an exemption received from the Canadian Securities Administrators);
- Entering into foreign exchange transactions (including both spot transactions and forward transactions) with National Bank of Canada.

The manager has implemented policies and procedures to make sure that the conditions applicable to each of the above transactions are met. The applicable standing instructions require that these transactions be carried out in accordance with NBI policies, which specify, in particular, that investment decisions pertaining to these related party transactions must be made free from any influence by an entity related to NBI and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to NBI. Furthermore, the investment decisions must represent the business judgment of the securities advisor, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interest of the Fund and must achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

### Registered Plan Trust Services

NTC receives a fixed amount per registered account for services provided as trustee for registered plans.

### Administrative and Operating Services

The provision of certain services was delegated by the Fund manager, NBII, to National Bank Trust Inc. ("NBT"), a wholly-owned indirect subsidiary of the Bank. These include accounting, reporting and portfolio valuation services. The fees incurred for these services are paid to NBT by the Fund manager.

## Management Fees

The Fund pays annual management fees to the Fund manager for its management services. The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the Fund's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. Under the *Distribution* heading, expenses include the broker's compensation consisting of the maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. Under the *Other* heading, the fees relate mainly to investment management, investment advisory services, general administration and profit. The breakdown of major services provided in consideration of the management fees, expressed as an approximate percentage of the management fees is as follows:

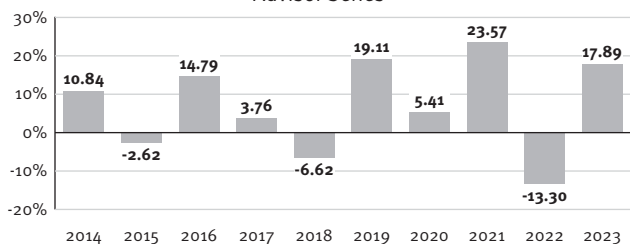
## Annual Returns

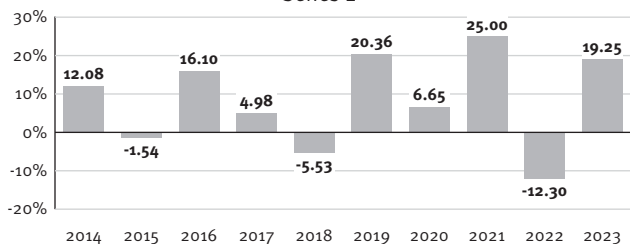

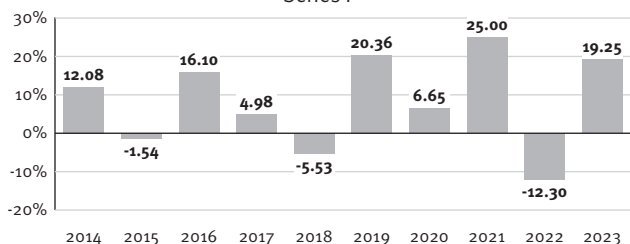
